## Viña Errázuriz Expands its Vineyards for Max Reserva Wines

The new Max VI vineyard is located in the Llay Llay area of the Aconcagua Valley, 80 km North of Santiago, 55 km from the Pacific Ocean and 390 meters above sea level. The South facing hillside property has a total of 180 hectares of which 47 hectares were planted between July and September of 2006.

The property enjoys a Mediterranean climate, with afternoon cooling breezes that come from the Pacific Ocean. In summer, temperature oscillation varies from a minimum of 12° Celsius to a maximum of 30° Celsius. Rainfall averages 238 mm and occurs only in winter time.

Max VI is crossed by a canal that comes from the Aconcagua River. In the upper part of the vineyard, soils are of coluvial origin, sandy clay loam with 30% of stones. Clay loam with 50% gravel soils are found in the lower part of the canal. Soil profile and drainage assure vine equilibrium and controlled vigour which will reflect in good ripening, acidity and fruit intensity.

Given the climatic and soil characteristics of the property,



34 hectares were planted to Shiraz (clones 174, 100 and 525). In the upper section of the estate which registers higher temperatures, 2 hectares of Carmenère was planted using masal selections from the best blocs of the Max II vineyard. The rest of the property was planted to Merlot (8 hectares), and Viognier (3 hectares).

Rows are planted with a 25°

N.W. orientation to capture the sun rays and vines in 2 by 1.40 meters (3,571 plants per hectare). In the case of Merlot, density is even higher, 2 by 1, 2 meters (4,167 plants per hectare). First harvest is expected for the 2008 vintage.

Drip irrigation is used throughout MAX VI with water pumped from a reservoir in the vineyard.

Degree days in Max VI (over 1,700 degree days) assure adequate ripening of all the varieties planted, in particular Carmenère which requires a minimum of 1,600 degree days. This condition assures wines with very good phenolic ripeness, while temperature oscillation promises wines with deep colour.

## Max I

Our flagship vineyard is planted with the classic Bordeaux varieties; Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Petit Verdot, Malbec and Shiraz. Different sectors of this vineyard are the source for Don Maximiano Founder's Reserve and Max Reserva Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot and Shiraz.



## Max II

The Max II vineyard produces Cabernet Sauvignon, Shiraz and Carmenère with distinctive forward fruit flavours and sweet tannins which are used as components for Max Reserva Cabernet Sauvignon and Shiraz.



## Max III

Viña Errázuriz certified organic vineyard since 2003 where Cabernet Sauvignon and Shiraz are grown sourcing of grapes for our Organic wine.



## Max IV

Planted in 1992 with Cabernet Sauvignon and Merlot, this deep clay loam vineyard is source of grapes for our Max Reserva Merlot producing a wine of round and velvet tannins.



## Max V

Located on the valley floor, the vineyard is planted with Cabernet Sauvignon, Shiraz and Carmenère grapes and source for our Max Reserva Cabernet Sauvignon and Shiraz producing wines with intense and lively colour as well as full and structured palate.




## Max VI

This vineyard was planted in 2006 to Shiraz, Merlot, Carmenère, and Viognier to source Max Reserva and Specialty wines.



## Manzanar Estate

Located in the coastal area of the Aconcagua Valley and just 14 km. from the Pacific Ocean, Manzanar vineyard was planted in 2005 to Sauvignon Blanc, Chardonnay, Pinot Noir, Merlot and Shiraz.



## La Escultura Estate

Located in the cool Casablanca Valley, and only 40 km. from the Pacific Ocean, Chardonnay, Sauvignon Blanc and Pinot Noir grapes are grown. Max Reserva Chardonnay grapes are hand harvested and selected from this property.
